- Higher education qualification in adult education (Bachelor, Graduate Certificate or Graduate Diploma) which includes a practicum component; plus TAELLN411 Address Adult Language, Literacy and Numeracy Skills, or demonstrated equivalence (of this unit); and
- Demonstrated current industry skills directly relevant to the training/assessment being undertaken.

Note: Proof of qualifications is required to be provided at interview.

Highly desirable requirements:

- Registered Nurse or Enrolled Nurse or equivalent health/primary health related qualification/s
- Relevant, current registration with AHPRA.
